

Provincial Programs and Tools to Source Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Alberta:

- [Alberta's Agriculture Training Support Program](#) will help employers in the food supply chain provide the necessary training to new domestic employees.
- Alberta has also created [ATB Nexus](#) where suppliers can list their PPE products available for sale for those looking to buy.

British Columbia:

- The [On-Farm Food Safety Program \(OFFS\)](#), through the Canadian Agricultural Partnership, is offering COVID-19 funding for agricultural and agri-food businesses. Eligible companies can seek funding to acquire PPE in order to maintain a safe workplace.
- [British Columbia's Food and Beverage organization](#) is acting as a hub for PPE for the BC agriculture and agri-food sector through which individual businesses orders can be submitted.

Manitoba:

- Manitoba has a site called [B2B Manitoba](#), an online marketplace to connect Manitoba businesses with non-medical grade PPE and other materials needed for businesses to operate during the in COVID-19 pandemic.

Nova Scotia:
